Value & Importance for Europe

- Long-term and large scale cross-disciplinary collaborations
- Create a unique Research & Innovation ecosystem
- Build Europe by focusing on jointly agreed priorities
- Shorten the research to innovation development cycles
- High international visibility
- Training, education and mobility of young researchers
- Structuring effects on national research and innovation
- Clear impact on S&T
- Too early to assess longer term impact on economy and society
- A strong asset for Europe for the future Framework Programme





How to maximise impact

- Based on Excellence in science, but need also to contribute to more European cohesion
- Need to strengthen the role, contributions and synergies with the Member States
 - * Access to centres of excellence, research capabilities and infrastructures?
 - Use of structural funds available for regional innovation investments?
 - Others?
- Sustaining useful activities after the flagship end
- Engage more with citizens and communicate expected benefits.





Towards FP9

- Proven value as mission oriented research initiatives
- In line with the recommendations of the 'Lamy report'
 - of having more mission oriented research
 - of engaging in more ambitious partnering with the Member States
- Discussions should be pursued on alignment, complementarity and synergies with national and regional initiatives when revising the Implementation model in FP9
- Keep an open and inclusive process in preparing new flagships
